Caribbean Lottery announces the automation of its draws

On July 24th, Caribbean Lottery (a GTECH/LiLHCo operation), changed the format of the drawings of its popular lottery games. The frequency and times of the draws remain as per usual, however, the draw shows are now completely automated and the use of mechanical draw machines has ceased. Automated draws are not strange to Caribbean Lottery as this concept has been in use with Caribbean Keno since the inception of the game.

Sheryl Jolly, Regional Sales and Marketing Manager of LiLHCo states,

“The technology and the process is akin to that used for the Caribbean Keno game, whereby a computer equipped with a Random Number Generator (RNG) randomly selects the winning numbers. The advantage associated with this process is the lack of manual intervention, thereby removing any possible risk of error. Electronic Random Number Generators are currently being used by several lotteries in North America and they offer the same randomness as the mechanical machines that the public is accustomed to seeing during the live draws. The automation of draws has been adopted by many lotteries worldwide and manual draws are fast becoming a thing of the past in several North American States.”

Ms. Jolly adds,

“We encourage our valued players to check the nearest Caribbean Lottery retailer for draw results of all games.”
